50TH Year Spotlight

D. Stephen Stone, Jr., Esq.



Anyone who has had the pleasure of working with Attorney Steve Stone knows that he is – as he puts it – an “honest dealer.” He keeps his word and that’s his advice for young attorneys. Do what you say you’re going to do. As he explained, judges figure out fast who they can trust. Steve also encourages young attorneys to set goals and

strive to achieve them.

Prior to his retirement, Steve practiced law for 47 years and one month in Alliance, Ohio. He graduated from Alliance High School and Mount Union College. He then attended law school at Case Western Reserve University and graduated in 1973. Steve’s dad and uncle were both attorneys in Alliance so upon his graduation, he joined his dad’s firm. Steve explained there was no pressure from his dad to go into law and that his dad allowed him to find his career path. Once at his dad’s firm, he taught Steve to use good common sense in approaching legal problems. In the early years of his practice, Steve focused on domestic relations matters. Over time, his practice shifted to an estate planning/probate practice.

Steve explained the most rewarding part of his practice was receiving thank-you notes from clients expressing their appreciation for his help in resolving a legal issue on their behalf. As with many attorneys, Steve has been very giving of his time volunteering in his community. He currently serves as the treasurer of the Alliance Historical Society. He previously served on the boards for the Alliance Domestic Violence Shelter, Alliance Area United Way, Alliance Board of Zoning Appeals and Stark County Legal Aid Society where he also served a term as President.

He also worked on the task force that assisted with the merger of the various United Way agencies in Stark County.

In addition to his community service, Steve also served as an acting judge for the Alliance Municipal Court. In that role, he learned how much drugs and alcohol factor into cases before the court. It should also be noted that Steve was President of the Stark County Bar Association from 2000-2001. This was the bar association’s centennial year and Steve was involved in burying the time capsule located on the grounds of the courthouse. In addition to serving as president, Steve also served on the Disputed Fee Committee and chaired the Grievance Committee. He was also involved in the state bar association serving on the OSBA Council of Delegates. In addition to all of this, Steve found time to teach as an adjunct professor of American National Government at Mt. Union College.

Since his retirement, Steve’s spending time catching up on books. He enjoys reading about the revolutionary war period in the United States. Steve feels lucky in many ways, he had a great family life growing up in Alliance. He married his wife, Pat, in 1974 and they have one daughter, Erin. The legal tradition continues in the Stone family with Erin who supervises felony prosecutions in Cuyahoga County.


