From Our President

I think we would all agree that the statement, “We believe that all individuals, including those who are impoverished, should have the opportunity to control, improve, and enrich their lives and community” is a belief we all hold.

In addition, I believe all Stark County Bar members would agree with the following statement:

“Through legal advocacy, we transform the lives of those in poverty to increase opportunities, fairness, and stability, for a stronger community and justice for all.”

However, you may not know that both the above statements are central tenets of **COMMUNITY LEGAL AID**, a non-profit Law Firm serving the legal needs of low-income individuals and families in northeast Ohio.

I arrived at Community Legal Aid as I was working on our Committee Spotlight for the month.

Legal Aid/Pro Bono

The duties of the **Legal Aid/Pro Bono Committee** shall be to supplement and assist in the activities of the Community Legal Aid in providing legal services for persons unable to pay for such services.

Beyond supporting Community Legal Aid, the other common factor between the two entities is Attorney David Butz. David has been a member of the Bar Association’s Legal Aid committee for many years, prior to becoming chair in 2021. Since 2017 he has also served as the President of the Board of Trustees of the Community Legal Aid. David understands the needs of our community and through his leadership, has offered the community programs in those areas of need.

A program that he and his committee have presented repeatedly is the Reinstatement Clinic. Most of us have probably had people call us, asking what they can do to get their driver’s license reinstated. We know how expensive it can be with accumulating courts costs, fines and fees. The clinic that Legal Aid has co-sponsored with the SCBA, is with the cooperation of the Ohio BMV and our local courts. As David stated to me, the courts involvement and support of the program is necessary to get a license reinstated. The committee is able to enter into a payment plan with the individual, and with the courts’ help, costs and fines can be reduced. Without this clinic,

the people they serve would likely never get their license reinstated because they wouldn’t know what to do and they couldn’t afford it if they had to pay all of the accumulated costs, fees and fines.

As part of this clinic, they will also offer Expungement services. They will explain and assist with the Expungement process.

The next Reinstatement Clinic will be on Saturday, October 19th in Canton. David’s committee will be present to run the clinic. The clinic is fortunate to have employees from David’s law firm Krugliak, Wilkins who will also assist that day. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact David Butz.

The Legal Aid/Pro Bono Committee also assists the Law Week Committee in May to staff the Justice Bus. Again, another community outreach tool to assist people with legal aid services. You will learn more about that as Law Week approaches.

Another function the committee services is the Help Desk in Family Court. This is a newer role undertaken.

Thank you, David Butz, Chair, and to your law firm for the support they give you in allowing you to do this vital

This year, we will take the opportunity to recognize local practitioners who are celebrating 50 years in the practice of law. Our next attorney to be recognized for a largely commendable 50 years of practice is Mark J. Skakun III, Esq.

50TH Year Spotlight

Mark J. Skakun III, Esq.



This month we celebrate Attorney Mark Skakun as our 50-year practitioner. Attorney Skakun has had quite a career litigating complex civil cases, with a focus on commercial and intellectual litigation. Prior to attending law school, Mark spent time at his father's law office, Attorney John Skakun, doing title work and watching depositions. After graduating from Central

Catholic High School and the University of Notre Dame (1971), Mark attended Case Western University School of Law graduating in 1974.

During his last year of law school, Attorney Skakun met Judge Leroy Contie, who at that time was serving on the bench for the United States District Court, Northern District of Ohio. Judge Contie did not have the funds in his budget to hire an additional law clerk so Attorney Skakun agreed to work for free several days per week. This gave Attorney Skakun the opportunity to learn the duties and responsibilities of a federal law clerk and he was also able to observe civil and criminal trials. Judge Contie recognized Attorney Skakun's talent and abilities and eventually hired him in 1974 upon his graduation from law school.

On September 1, 1977, Attorney Skakun started his career at Buckingham, Doolittle & Burroughs, LLC and became a partner in 1982. He has spent his entire career with the firm. Attorney Skakun's practice has always focused on civil litigation and he also handled criminal matters for approximately 15 years. He has handled more than 100 jury trials – at one time handling six jury trials in a nine-week period. He explained that trials were different earlier in his practice. The parties conducted minimal discovery and the matter proceeded to trial. Attorney Skakun's trial skills were not limited to Ohio. He also tried cases in California, Texas and New York. At one point in his career, he was handling more cases out-of-state than in Ohio.

Attorney Skakun explained that to be a successful trial lawyer you have to properly frame the issues, find the moral high ground and tell a good story to keep the

jury's attention. His personal philosophy, and advice to young lawyers is to recognize that lawyers are here to resolve disputes and not cause other lawsuits. One should look at opposing counsel not as an adversary but a friend and potential referral source. He explained that with this approach, you can develop good relationships with opposing counsel which is helpful when opposing counsel is a member of the legal community where you regularly practice.

In addition to Judge Contie and his father serving as mentors, Attorney Skakun also recognizes his father-in-law, Judge Harold DeHoff, and Attorneys James Herndon and Gary Banas as friends and mentors who had a positive impact on his legal career. Attorney Skakun acknowledges the importance of mentors and he participates in the Ohio Supreme Court's mentoring program for new lawyers.
