From Our President

Allow me to introduce myself, in an admittedly roundabout fashion, and explain how I became rooted here in Stark County, Ohio. I was born into a military family where I learned quickly about new beginnings. My parents met in Meridian, Mississippi, my Mother's hometown, in the summer of 1964. During that time my father, a young U. S. Navy sailor, was sent with his unit to Mississippi to participate in the extensive search for three missing men. These men – civil rights activists, James Chaney, Andrew Goodman, and Michael Schwerner - had been working with the Freedom Summer campaign to register African Americans in Mississippi to vote and had travelled to Longdale, a small town about ½ hour outside of Meridian on this mission. Chaney, Goodman and Schwerner mysteriously disappeared after a traffic stop and their burnt-out vehicle was found 3 days later near a swamp. It took several weeks for the bodies of these men to be recovered and during those weeks the sailors engaged in the dirty work of finding them. Eventually, an FBI investigation revealed that local White Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, the Neshoba County Sheriff's Office, and the Philadelphia Police Department were involved in the incident. Remarkably, some good arose from this deplorable chapter of U.S. history - outrage over the activists' murders served as a catalyst for the passage of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and my parents met.

My father retired from the U.S. Navy after 20 years. During his years of service, after being born in Meridian, Mississippi, I experienced new beginnings in Virginia Beach, Virginia while he was stationed in Norfolk and Memphis, Tennessee while he was stationed in Millington. Dad then enlisted in the U.S. Army as a recruiter and served our country another 10 years while stationed in East Cleveland, Ohio and Omaha, Nebraska. Ultimately, our family settled in Tennessee where I attended the University of Memphis and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Theater and Communications. Roots in Portage County, Ohio where my father was born and Stark County where my older sisters lived brought me out of the south and back to Northeast Ohio, and specifically Canton, Ohio.

I enrolled in the University of Akron School of Law and graduated in 1996. I ventured into private practice in 2001. This is when I discovered the Stark County Bar Association and began participating in the Lawyer Referral Program as a way of building my fledgling law practice. As a sole practitioner, I found the resources that the Bar Association provided, including CLE's, the blue book attorney directory, and networking to be invaluable. Over time, I transitioned from seeking the Bar's services to serving on several committees, including Pro Bono, Grievance, Family Law, the Executive Committee and now as an officer. In October of 2023, I made a big pivot in my career, choosing to close my 22 year old law practice and started serving Stark County on the bench as a Magistrate for the Stark County Family Court.

Now, as I transition to the new role of serving as Bar President, I want to extend thanks to all of those who have served as exceptional Chairpersons on the numerous active committees which are vital to our Bar Association and to welcome those who have graciously agreed to serve during my term. I especially want to welcome the newly appointed Chairpersons.

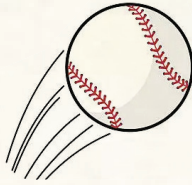


125th Celebration Art Show Gala and Exhibit

This year, we will take the opportunity to recognize local practitioners who are celebrating 50 years in the practice of law. Our next attorney to be recognized for a largely commendable 50 years of practice is Michael Zirpolo, Esq.

50TH Year Spotlight

Michael Zirpolo, Esq.



Attorney Michael Zirpolo was born and raised in Canton. He attended Our Lady of Peace for grade school and St. Thomas Aquinas for high school. He then went on to study at Walsh College, now Walsh University. Attorney Zirpolo then went to earn his JD from Ohio Northern University.

Why did you decide to become a lawyer?

As a child growing up in Canton, Ohio in the 1950's and 1960's, I did not realize what a closed society I lived in. I was a great television watcher. I did not know what an attorney was until I started watching Perry Mason. I found Perry Mason fascinating, and that is what set me on the course to be an attorney. No one in my family had gone to college or was an attorney, I was the first.

What has been your main area of practice?

I started and spent the first ten years of my career at the county prosecutor's office where I learned so many valuable skills. Civil, criminal, and appellate trial practice, how county government operates... impossible to state the many benefits I received working for the county prosecutor's office. We need the experience to learn.

While in the prosecutor's office, I gradually transitioned to the civil division and began interacting with the County Commissioners. At the time, the County still possessed Molly Stark Hospital and the Joseph T. Nist Home (county

owned nursing home). I began working for the Commissioners as counsel to get special projects completed. Such as closing Molly Stark and getting the Nist Home sold. These projects took approximately three years to complete.

Once I completed these special projects, the Commissioners sent me to the Multi-County Juvenile Attention Center. In this position, I was able to utilize all of the legal tools that I had accumulated through the years regarding county government. I learned quickly from working in this role that the Juvenile Center was actually a valuable community asset to help kids at a cross road choose a path outside of the criminal justice system. As chief legal counsel to the Commissioners, I was responsible for Human Resource matters for approximately 185 employees, as well as the liaison with other county commissioners and judges regarding the Multi-County Center.

During this time, I also had a private practice where I focused on plaintiff's civil litigation. Another incredible mentoring opportunity came with my membership in the Stark County Academy of Trial Lawyers. The lawyers within this group provided great advice and guidance on civil litigation that other attorneys had to share. This was a wonderful experience and got me into an interaction with other like-minded attorneys. Fifty years later, I am still a member of this organization, now named the Stark County Academy for Justice.

What have been the biggest changes in the practice of law that you have witnessed over the past 50 years and have they been for the better? How have these changes impacted your practice?

The biggest change for me has been technology and computerization. Although I may not have known how to turn on a computer on January 1, 2000, I resolved in the new millennium to learn. I gradually came to the realization of how great technology can be, especially in the law library. I

believe that technology has vastly improved client communications as well. I find emails to clients can be highly effective in providing clients with the information they need and can refer back to.

What has been the most fulfilling aspect of your career?

The essence of it is that if you are a good lawyer, who prepares before you go to court, doesn't use AI to write briefs, checks your citations... you may end up in a good place with your client as you navigate the minefield of civil litigation. If you move along the process, it is very fulfilling to get to that point with your client.

Do you have a favorite legal movie or book?

I do not read fiction and I am very particular of the movies I watch. However, I am fascinated by American history, from the absolutely majestic to the horrible. For example, an author named Robert Caro has written a biography of Lyndon Johnson that encompasses four or five volumes. These non-fiction books are transformative as they go into the nuts and bolts of the election of the Democratic Convention of 1960, choosing John F. Kennedy as the nominee for President and Johnson as the Vice President.

What is the best advice you can give new lawyers entering the profession?

Collaboration is essential when practicing civil litigation as a solo practitioner. Even when utilizing technology, attorneys must still exercise due care and take the time to communicate with clients. There are no short cuts in the practice of law. There is no substitute for doing what has to be done. If you get a phone call, text message or email you have to respond promptly.

Secondly, do not use AI to write your briefs. If you do, you better rigorously edit it before handing it to a judge. It is an insult to the practice of law, it is an insult to the court and to the client that is paying you to prepare something. Lawyers are under pressure, I have been there, I did it for fifty years. It is work; it is hard work. We as lawyers take an oath, but we must always do what we need to do as required by the law to represent the client. Doing less will invariably catch up with you.

I am not a very nostalgic person; in another life I am a historian. I am fascinated by history. My studies as a historian have led me to the conclusion that there really were no good old days, the good old days are now. Human nature is consistent. You have to appreciate the people you are dealing with now, because they may not be there.

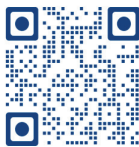
