

#### The Power of Secondary Sources: When and Why to Use Them

Legal research can often feel like a race against the clock. Whether you're preparing for court, drafting a client memo, or exploring a new area of law, you need accurate, authoritative answers - and fast.

Used effectively, secondary sources deepen understanding, uncover issues, and lead directly to controlling authority.

#### What Are Secondary Sources?

Secondary sources explain, interpret, or analyze the law. They are written by legal scholars, practitioners, and subject matter experts, and while not binding authority, they offer valuable context and persuasive guidance.

### When Should You Use a Secondary Source?

#### 1. Starting in an Unfamiliar Area of Law

When you're working outside your usual practice area - or facing a novel issue - secondary sources provide an efficient entry point. A good treatise or practice manual will outline the basic rules, define key terms, and explain important exceptions. For example, if you don't regularly handle landlord-tenant disputes but need to draft a lease provision or respond to an eviction notice, starting with **Baldwin's Ohio Practice: Landlord-Tenant Law** can help you identify key statutes, relevant cases, and typical pleadings.

#### 2. Saving Time When the Clock Is Ticking

It's often more efficient to begin with a secondary source than to jump into keyword searching in a case law database. Instead of spending an hour refining Boolean searches on Lexis+ or Westlaw, a quick scan of *Ohio Jurisprudence* or *Anderson's Ohio Civil Practice* might give you what you need in a fraction of the time.

#### 3. Finding Practical Tools and Samples

Many secondary sources include checklists, model forms, or sample clauses. These are especially useful for transactional work, motion practice, or complex filings. Using vetted templates can help ensure your documents are complete, compliant, and

professional. These resources can be found in publications like **West's Legal Forms**, **Ohio Transaction Guide**, or annotated commentary accompanying Ohio-specific statutes.

#### 4. Identifying Majority and Minority Views

When you're researching a multi-jurisdictional issue, secondary sources - particularly ALR annotations and Restatements - summarize how courts have ruled on similar facts. This can help shape your argument, especially if Ohio law is unsettled or silent on a topic.

#### **How to Use Them Strategically**

- Start Broad, Then Narrow Begin with encyclopedias, then move to treatises or law reviews for deeper analysis.
- Follow Citations Let footnotes lead you to controlling statutes and cases.
- **Use Filters** Narrow results by source type, jurisdiction, or title.
- Validate Confirm cases and statutes are still good law with Shepard's or KeyCite.

#### **Accessing Secondary Sources at the Law Library**
