One topic frequently discussed by the audience of lawyers, colleagues and family members at the theater located within the McKinley Presidential Library and Museum was the continued relevance of the subject matter in the play and the concept that the more things change the more they same the same. Clearly - and fortunately for many, me included - there have been enormous advancements in society since 1900 when our Stark County Bar Association was established with the signatures of the original 99 members. During that era Stark County was a center for progress with industry booming and Canton native William McKinley being elected to serve his

second term on November 6, 1900. Unfortunately, our Stark County history includes the tragic assassination of President McKinley in September of 1901.

It is remarkable to me that on April 14, 1865, only 35 short years before this Bar Association was formed, President Abraham Lincoln, one of the foremost proponents of the 13th amendment to the U.S. Constitution, was assassinated. Vice President Andrew Johnson succeeded to the presidency and eventually managed to complete the ratification of the Thirteenth Amendment on December 18, 1865, thereby abolishing slavery in this nation. In 1870, only 30 years before our Bar Association started, the 15th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, was ratified, prohibiting states from denying a citizen the right to vote based on "race, color, or previous condition of servitude". Although an abundance of history surrounds the years following this landmark civil rights achievement, I only mention it here as a reminder of the temporal proximity of these pivotal events in our nation to the formation of our association.

Our noble profession is built upon ensuring justice for all under the laws created by and for humankind and I would like to believe that our founding members envi-

sioned the future of our bar association becoming the progressive and diverse association of over 650 members that exists today, continuing to uphold their original mission with strong leadership, including an actual black woman as its President. Despite the persistence of human nature and also because of it, we have come a long way for sure and yet we have a long way to go!

Our active members make our association successful. Thank you to the Military and Veterans Affairs Committee and the Community Involvement Committee and to everyone who donated to the SAM CENTER as part of our 2025 Thanksgiving Basket Drive. The Community Involvement Committee is currently offering an Adopt-A-Family through Community Christmas - be sure to stop into the Bar office as soon as possible - the deadline is December 5th. Speaking of deadlines - if this is your year to renew your registration, consider supporting our Bar Association by taking advantage of the live courses offered by SCBA or the online courses offered 24/7.
